

Kolkata, The City of Joy (known as Calcutta till 2001), India's one of the largest metro city and once the capital (1772-1912) of British India, is the capital of West Bengal. Kolkata is located on the east bank of the Hooghly, a channel of the Ganges, 154 km upstream from the Bay of Bengal. Growing beyond its British colonial foundations, Kolkata assimilated strong European influences to create an amalgam culture that found early expression in the life and works of the 19th-century Bengali elite and its best known personality, Rabindranath Tagore. Kolkatans are said to possess a rare joie de vivre that manifests itself in their penchant for art and culture and a level of intellectual vitality and politico. This city, a flourishing metropolis, a beautiful blend of the vintage and the modern, the tradition and the innovation, began the era of cultural renaissance in India.

Kolkata is the main business, commercial and financial hub of eastern India and the northeastern states with a major commercial and military port and an international airport. Some famous places in Kolkata are Victoria Memorial, Howrah Bridge, Botanical Garden, New Town Eco Park, Mother Teresa House, Fort William, Dakshineshwar Temple, Alipore Zoological Gardens, Kalighat Kali Temple. Eden Gardens, Indian Museum, Princep Ghats, Marble Palace, Belur Math. Popular Things in Kolkata are Bengali Food, Trams, Durga Puja, Kolkata Metro, Hand Pulled Rickshaw, Street Food and Bengali Sweets.

Kolkata has a tropical climate. The annual mean temperature is 26.8 °C (80 °F). Winter tends to last for only about two and a half months, with seasonal lows dipping to 12 °C -14 °C (54 °F -57 °F) between December and January.
